In a secret ballot election conducted by the NLRB on March 21, 2024, the organizers working for the Teamsters International Union in Washington, D.C. voted 16 to 12 **AGAINST** being represented by a union.

In other words, **the Teamster organizers had the same answer to union representation that Sofidel employees had in 2021: NO THANKS!** As many of you already know, employees here at Sofidel in 2021 voted against representation by the USW by a 3-1 margin! Since that time, Sofidel has made numerous improvements directly benefiting employees.

It is a shame that the paid organizers the Teamsters have brought in to sell all of you on union representation aren't telling you the whole story.

Tell the Teamster organizers “No Thanks” to Union representation – they will understand, because they did too.
