Unwanted Visitors?

Sofidel has heard that paid Teamster organizers are again bothering employees at their homes. We do not know how they have obtained your address – the Company did not provide it!

Here are the important points to know:

- You do not have to let the Teamsters organizers interrupt you at home;
- You have the legal right to refuse to talk to them, or answer any questions, and instead treat them like any other door-to-door salesperson;
- You can legally tell them that you don't want to be visited at home.

Please don't sign a card!

Don't let the Teamsters sell you what you don't need.

Don't Sign a Union Card!

During the home visits Sofidel has heard are going on again, those paid Teamster organizers may ask you to sign a union card. We urge you not to do so!

If the Teamsters get a majority of employees to sign union cards, then it could try to force itself on everyone, even if the majority of you vote against it. This is called a "bargaining order," and it takes away your right to have your voice heard in a secret ballot election.

So, if you are not convinced a Union is necessary here at Sofidel, don't sign a card just to get the organizer off your front porch.

And, if you signed a card in the past, but wish you had not, then it is your legal right contact the Teamsters or the person who asked you to sign it, and demand to have it returned to you!

If you want your voice heard in a secret ballot election, don't sign a card — it is not necessary.
